Public Health Information Management System (PHIMS)



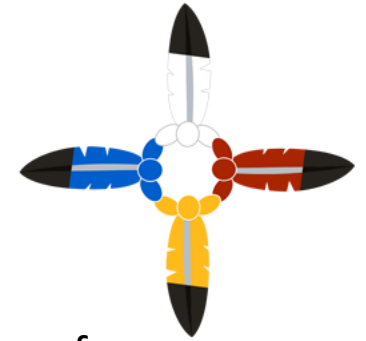
- Provincial electronic public health record that manages immunizations and vaccines
 - 22 Health centres have direct access
 - 1 Federal Nursing Station
 - 3 Provincial Nursing Stations
- Limited number – insufficient connectivity
- FNIHB and West Regional Tribal Health Services-bridging service organizations

PHIMS Next Steps



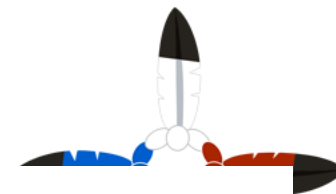
- Phase 2 deployment include:
 - Communicable Disease Investigation module
 - Covid 19 Quick Entry
 - Resolution Support needed
- Data exchange between PHIMS and Mustimuhw (community electronic medical record)

Kihew Utin eHealth Transformation

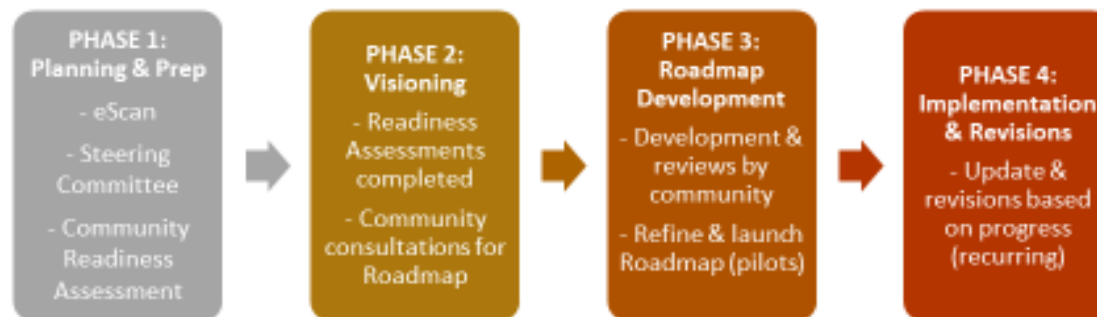


- The mandate of the eHealth Transformation department is:
 1. To develop and implement an **eHealth Transformation Roadmap** (strategic plan) for the transfer of eHealth programming from Indigenous Services Canada FNIHB-MB to the FNHSSM that prioritizes local First Nation community needs, collaboration with partners and stakeholders, and on-going evaluation and advancement.
 2. Enhance overall effectiveness and efficiency of eHealth and health information management systems used by communities.
- The FNHSSM has been mandated to take on this work via a Resolution received at a Joint Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs and FNHSSM Chiefs Assembly, MAR-16.05. The project is guided by **the eANISKOPITAK Stewards Circle** that is chaired by Chiefs representing north and south, with Tribal Council representatives and independent Manitoba First Nations.
- The eHealth Transformation Project is funded through the Health Services Integration Fund (HSIF) of FNIHB Indigenous Services Canada, Manitoba Region for three (3) years, 2020-2023.
- *The project was given its name—**Kihew Utin** (meaning “eagle wind” in Cree)—through a Shake Tent Ceremony conducted by Cree Elder, Andrew Nanooch. Our colours are yellow, red, blue, and white.*

Kihew Utin eHealth Transformation



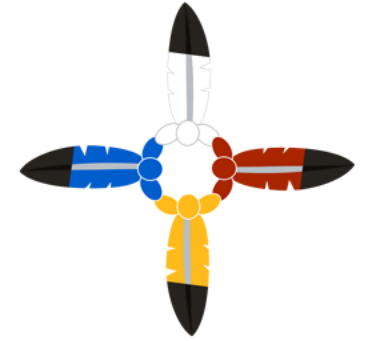
At the heart of developing the Roadmap is **extensive community engagement** with First Nations, tribal councils, and other stakeholders in the planning and development using a phased approach:



We are currently completing Phase 1 with the following activities completed:

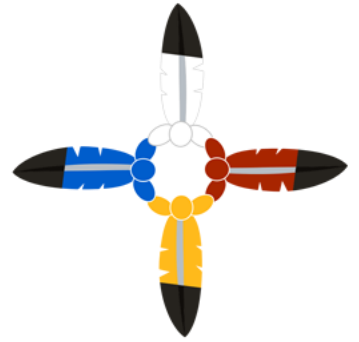
1. **Kihew Utin Project Team**—established consisting of a Project Manager, Assistant Project Manager, and Policy Analyst
2. **Kihew Utin Steering Committee**—formed to guide the technical activities of the overall project; selections were nominated by members of eAniskopitak and from recommendations within eHealth
3. **MB First Nations eHealth Environmental Scan**—outlines the current landscape of ehealth/digital health resources within the province, as related to First Nations
4. **MB First Nations Clinical & Technical Readiness Assessment**—formal assessment developed to understand the ehealth technical readiness & requirements of each First Nation in Manitoba; each FN will be contacted throughout Year 2
5. **Community Engagement Strategy & Process Plan**—developed to formalize the process, content, and schedule of consultations with communities, stakeholders, and ehealth experts to be carried out in Year 2
6. **Evaluation Framework**—developed to establish a baseline and progress of stated activities throughout the course of the overall project (2020-2023)

Kihew Utin eHealth Transformation Next Steps



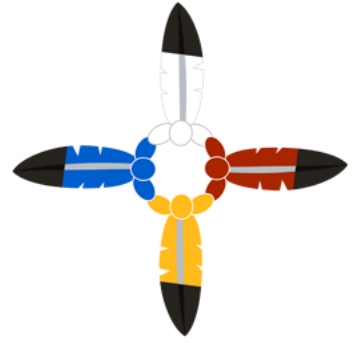
- We are moving into **PHASE 2: VISIONING** and will be conducting extensive Community Engagements throughout Year 2:
- **Community Readiness Assessments (CRA)**— each First Nation in Manitoba will be contacted to complete a Community Readiness Assessment
 - CRA is part of the environmental scan and will be used to inform technical requirements of the Roadmap
 - This will be completed through a formal interview by Transformation team members, either virtually or by phone
- **Stakeholder engagements** – Tribal councils and stakeholders to be contacted for input, guidance, recommendations, identification of long-term goals, and technical requirements of eHealth transfer
 - Dependent upon Covid-19 public health orders and direction of participants, these engagements may be conducted in-person or virtually (Teams)
- **Community Engagements**—Communities will be contacted for input, guidance, recommendations, identification of long-term goals, and local requirements of eHealth transfer
 - Dependent upon Covid-19 public health orders and direction of participants, these engagements may be conducted in-person or virtually (Teams)
- As input and information is gathered from communities, tribal councils, and stakeholders, the eHealth Transformation Team will begin writing the formal *Kihew Utin Transformation Roadmap* to be ready to move in **Phase 3: Roadmap Development & Reviews** in Year 3.

Community Electronic Medical Record(cEMR)



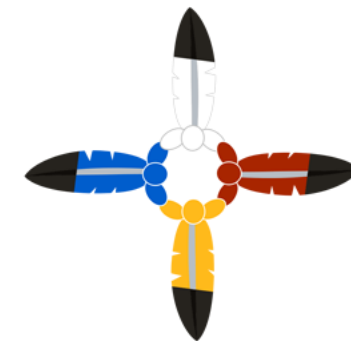
- Mustimuhw(cEMR) is an electronic client record and charting system used at a First Nation health facility
- 21 First Nation sites currently have access
- Program areas include:
 - Jordan's Principle
 - Home and Community Care
 - Community Health
 - Mental Wellness
